DISCIPLE MAKING IN THE WESLEYAN TRADITION

The Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church states that “The mission of the church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. . .”

On May 10th at 7:00 p.m. Pastor George will lead a workshop on Disciple Making in the Bible and in the Wesleyan Tradition. We will be looking at Jesus’ call to “come and follow me” and to “Go and make disciples”. And John Wesley’s teaching on discipleship and how we can apply these teachings today so that we may be better equipped to make disciples for Jesus Christ.

All are welcome to attend this time of teaching and discussion. This will be the first in a series of workshops led by Pastor George on Disciple Making, Outreach and Church Growth.

MISSIONS

Heifer Project – During the month of May we will be collecting to send animals to needy families of our own country and around the world. When a family receives their animals(s), they agree to pass on the first-born female to another family and that family passes to another family. Training and support is given as well as breeding aid to enable your gift to continue as a “living gift” changing whole villages and communities.

Put your donation in the envelope marked for Heifer Project that is in your weekly bulletin during the month of May (also put your envelope number from your normal giving envelope in order to receive credit for your gift) and place in the collection plate. Make your check payable to Allentown UMC and write Heifer in the lower left hand corner. If you cannot attend church during the month of May and wish to help, send your donation to the church office.

Remember – a flock of chicks is \$20. Starting at 6 months they can lay 200 eggs a year – protein for children and extras sold to pay for school, clothes, and medicine. A trio of rabbits is \$60. With as many as 40 offspring a year, a trio can provide a family with a steady source of protein and income. A goat is \$120. A goat can give up to 4 quarts of milk a day – just the right amount if you don't own a refrigerator. Manure fertilizes the vegetable crops, and they often give birth to 2 kids a year. They provide a steady source of income.
